



Procedure for Conducting Idaho FFA Business

Approved 2022

Items of business coming before the Idaho FFA Board of Directors may originate from:

- State officer team
- Member of the Idaho FFA Board
- Chapter or other entity and presented to the Board by an IATA District Director, state officer, state staff, or board member

Amendments to the Idaho FFA Constitution or By-Laws must proceed as stated in the Constitution.

Delegate proposals must be submitted to State FFA Staff by the Midwinter Idaho FFA Board Meeting. The Board will be notified of submissions. Delegate proposals will be reviewed by state staff and state officers and determined whether to be Delegate Issues at Convention. Delegate Issues will be shared with chapters by the time Convention registration opens. Any resolutions coming from the delegates will then come back before the Summer IATA In-Service through the applicable IATA committees where needed. IATA committees will then submit their support or non-support opinion and comments to the FFA Board at its meeting during Summer In-Service. The FFA Board has final decision on supporting or choosing to not support delegate resolutions, opinions of IATA committees and implementing the next steps for items moving forward. Input from IATA committees on delegate resolutions will help advise timing for implementation of items such as new competitive events and conferences.

Delegate approval is not required for most business coming before the FFA Board unless constitutional or by-law approval amendments are proposed. It is the intent of the student-led organization that delegates do have opportunity to have great discussions and an active role in the workings of their organization, so when possible, state staff and state officers can work to create delegate committees for the purpose of generating ideas and improving programming. These type delegate issues may not come before the Midwinter FFA Board meeting because they are to be developed as the need for input and information arises and will be developed in the months leading up to Convention.
